AS WE GATHER

In today's Old Testament reading, a righteous shepherd-king was supposed to unite the people to follow the God of Israel. But their wicked policies had the effect of causing the Babylonian exile and scattering God's flock. In contrast to Israel's wicked shepherd-kings who in effect scattered the flock, Yahweh himself will regather the remnant and restore them to their land. Yahweh himself will undo and reverse their damage.

Jesus is our Shepherd-King. By His grace, our Lord Jesus we can sing of the mercy of our God forever! "For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 100:5) and "As for You, O Lord, You will not restrain Your mercy from me; Your steadfast love and Your faithfulness will ever preserve me!" (Ps 40:11).
