AS WE GATHER

This Spring and Summer we have seen the powerful destructive force of rising water, powerful enough cause mud slides, tear out trees, destroy bridges, cause dams to fail flooding crops and businesses and homes. It's estimated 11.6 million cubic yards of sediment was sent downstream after the partial failure of the Rapidan Dam in Mankato, destroying over 2,500 properties. By God's grace, there were no fatalities due to the Rapidan Dam's partial failure.

In Sunday's Old Testament reading while Noah and his family were sealed up in the ark, God displays His wrath and the consequences of wickedness and sin by a flood. Then God gives Noah and us a visible sign of the covenant. Never again will he destroy the world by a flood. This Sunday we will hear that God alone provides hope—through the covenant he makes with Noah and creation and, ultimately, through Jesus and his cross.

- P Humble yourselves, then, before God, confess your sins to Him, and implore His forgiveness.
C **O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a troubled and penitent sinner, confess to You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your present and eternal punishment. By nature I am a sinful creature. By thought, word, and deed**

I have continually transgressed Your law. For the sake of the sufferings and death of Your Son, Jesus Christ, be gracious and merciful to me, a penitent and contrite being. Forgive me all my sins and grant me the power of Your Holy Spirit that I may amend my sinful life.

P God be gracious to you and strengthen your faith.

C **Amen.**

P As you believe, so let it be. As a called and ordained servant Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

But immediately he spoke to them and said, “Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid.” ⁵¹And he got into the boat with them, and the wind ceased. villages, cities, or countryside, they laid the sick in the marketplaces and implored him that they might touch even the fringe of his garment. And as many as touched it were made well.

*CATECHISM

The Second Article

P We have begun our worship this day in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Let us speak together the words of the Apostles' Creed regarding the Second Person of the Holy Trinity.

C **I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.**

P What does this mean?

C **I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord,**

who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death,

that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness,

just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

This is most certainly true.
