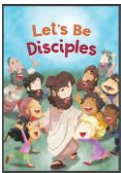
Welcome Guests

Large Print copies of the Worship Folders are available. Please ask an usher.

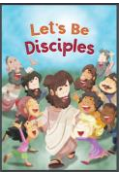


Vacation Bible School at TLO
